### DISCUSSION

## DISCUSSION

In the weekend services Katie, one of our career missionaries, shared that she is moving to the Himalayas in March. In the region, there is a practice called Chhaupadi, which is based on the belief that women are impure during their menstrual cycle and while giving birth. Because of their impurity, they must live separately from the rest of the community, usually staying in their families' cowsheds, believing that if they don't they will bring a curse on their families; that if anyone gets sick or if anything bad happens, it will be their fault. Approximately 72% of women in the rural areas follow this practice, and it not infrequently results in sexual abuse, sickness, and even death. Into this situation Katie is feeling called to bring her skills as a nurse, and the gospel of Jesus, to work for holistic reconciliation.

Take time to pray for Katie as she relocates next month, and that God would work through her to bring reconciliation to the people of that region.
